First Reading

Neh 8:2-6. 8-10

Ezra the priest brought the Law before the assembly, consisting of men, women, and children old enough to understand. This was the first day of the seventh month. On the square before the Water Gate, in the presence of the men and women, and children old enough to understand, he read from the book from early morning till noon; all the people listened attentively to the Book of the Law. Ezra the scribe stood on a wooden dais erected for the purpose. In full view of all the people since he stood higher than all the people - Ezra opened the book; and when he opened it all the people stood up. Then Ezra blessed the Lord, the great God, and all the people raised their hands and answered Amen! Amen! Then they bowed down and, face to the ground, prostrated themselves before the Lord. And Ezra read from the Law of God, translating and giving the sense, so that the people understood what was read. Then Nehemiah - His Excellency - and Ezra, priest and scribe (and the Levites who were instructing the people) said to all the people, 'This day is sacred to the Lord your God. Do not be mournful, do not weep'. For the people were all in tears as they listened to the words of the Law. He then said, 'Go, eat the fat, drink the sweet wine, and send a portion to the man who has nothing prepared ready. For this day is sacred to our Lord. Do not be sad: the joy of the Lord is your stronghold.'

citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink. Nor is the body to be identified with any one of its many parts. Now you together are Christ's body; but each of you is a different part of it. Gospel Lk 1:1-4. 4:14-21

Seeing that many others have undertaken to draw up accounts of the events that have taken place among us, exactly as these were handed down to us by those who from the outset were eyewitnesses and ministers of the word, I in my turn, after carefully going over the whole story from the beginning, have decided to write an ordered account for you, Theophilus, so that your Excellency may learn how well founded the teaching is that you have received. Jesus, with the power of the Spirit in him, returned to Galilee; and his reputation spread throughout the countryside. He taught in their synagogues and everyone praised him. He came to Nazara, where he had been brought up, and went into the synagogue on the sabbath day as he usually did. He stood up to read, and they handed him the scroll of the prophet Isaiah. Unrolling the scroll, he found the place where it is written: The spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for he has anointed me. He has sent me to bring the good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives

and to the blind new sight, to set the downtrodden free, to proclaim the Lord's year of favour.

He then rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the assistant and sat down. And

An Update from our Advisory Group

St Luke's Catholic Faith Community has an advisory group to support the leadership of this community. At our recent meeting, there were plenty of things to discuss as we look forward to an exciting and full year. Please let me know if you would like further information about any of these points:

- We will hold a Liturgy workshop in the next few months to assist liturgical ministers undertake their roles.
- We will hold a Lenten 'Retreat' afternoon (3 hours on a Saturday afternoon) during Lent. Date to be confirmed.
- We will look to have 'Stations of the Cross' on the Friday evenings during Lent at our offices (2 Springdale St, Marsden Park).
- We will have a full Holy Week of liturgies with Masses on Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday as well as Stations of the Cross on Good Friday Morning and 3pm Good Friday service.
- We are grateful that Couples for Christ have volunteered to provide morning tea once a month and will also assist with music ministry.
- We are still looking for someone to lead our Welcoming Ministry. This involves coordinating the roster of welcomers before Mass as well as ensuring someone is at the Welcome Table after Mass each Sunday.
- We will have a full Sacramental Program this year – First Communion, Reconciliation and Confirmation. We are looking for people to assist in being on a Sacramental Ministry team.

- people willing to be part of a committee to help establish and run this program.
- We are looking to start a Youth Ministry program and are talking to potential leaders.
- We will hold a special celebration to commemorate our 1st anniversary. It will take place on Divine Mercy Sunday, 28th April 2019. We are looking for people to assist in coordinating this activity.
- We will have some consistency with our Celebrants soon with Fr John Hogan (Rector of the Seminary for the Diocese of Parramatta) to be with us from mid-February until the end of April. After that we will be utilising Priests from Blacktown and Marayong Parishes.

So, as you can see, there is plenty planned for 2019 in our new community. But we will need a lot of help to make it happen. Please consider assisting us.


