Second reading

Col 1:12-20

We give thanks to the Father who has made it possible for you to join the saints and with them to inherit the light. Because that is what he has done: he has taken us out of the power of darkness and created a place for us in the kingdom of the Son that he loves, and in him, we gain our freedom, the forgiveness of our sins. He is the image of the unseen God and the first-born of all creation, for in him were created all things in heaven and on earth: everything visible and everything invisible, Thrones, Dominations, Sovereignties, Powers all things were created through him and for him. Before anything was created, he existed, and he holds all things in unity. Now the Church is his body, he is its head. As he is the Beginning, he was first to be born from the dead, so that he should be first in every way; because God wanted all perfection to be found in him and all things to be reconciled through him and for him, everything in heaven and everything on earth, when he made peace by his death on the cross.

Gospel

Lk 23:35-43

The people stayed there before the cross, watching Jesus. As for the leaders, they jeered at him. 'He saved others,' they said, 'let him save himself if he is the Christ of God, the Chosen One.' The soldiers mocked him too, and when they approached to

offer him vinegar they said, 'If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself.' Above him there was an inscription: 'This is the King of the Jews.' One of the criminals hanging there abused him. 'Are you not the Christ?' he said. 'Save yourself and us as well.' But the other spoke up and rebuked him. 'Have you no fear of God at all?' he said. 'You got the same sentence as he did, but in our case we deserved it: we are paying for what we did. But this man has done nothing wrong. Jesus,' he said, 'remember me when you come into your kingdom.' 'Indeed, I promise you,' he replied, 'today you will be with me in paradise.'

Reflection: Positive human actions in a time of crisis

Having spent much of this week up in fire affected areas on the mid-north coast, I have returned with a great appreciation of the great positive power that people can muster when they decide to work together in a spirit of collaboration, self-sacrifice and communal spirit. I spent time in Kempsey and Macksville at centres set up to respond to people affected by bushfires. I witnessed so many positive and heart-warming examples of the best of human nature: the loving support that people showed for their neighbours - regardless of whether they had been worse or less affected by the fires than themselves, the great resilience of people who have lost their homes and possessions, the gratitude of people for everything that they received - from a meal, a cup of coffee, a listening ear, fodder for their cattle, the wonderful collaboration of so many agencies, from Red Cross, to Anglicare, mental health providers, disaster welfare volunteers, government departments, the rural fire service and other emergency service providers and our disaster relief chaplains.

There were heartbreaking stories of loss. People who had built their house with their own hands who now have only burnt out rubble. Precious family items of significance, passed on from generation to generation, now shattered amidst the ashes. Families with up to 6 children who now have nowhere to live and few possessions remaining. People faced with the dilemma of whether to rebuild or to



move elsewhere – or even the question of whether they can afford to house their families at all.

Amidst this there were also less attractive sides of human nature that were on display – some people wanting to take more than their fair share of the goods on offer, some cases of looting of fire affected properties, some people using their idle time to over indulge in alcohol and then behaving in unsociable ways.

But the overwhelming experience was that of positive human actions in a time of crisis. If you are able to, please donate to one of the fire relief charities – eg Vinnies at (https://donate.vinnies.org.au/appealsnsw/vinnies-nsw-bushfire-appeal-nsw). And please pray for those impacted by the bushfires. The fires are far from being extinguished and many people are still not able to return to their homes. Towns are full of people living in motels and B&Bs because they cannot go home. The rebuilding will take months or years. The emotional cost, for some, will last for the rest of their lives. They need our ongoing support and prayers.
