First Reading

Is 7:10-14

The Lord spoke to Ahaz and said, ‘Ask the Lord your God for a sign for yourself coming either from the depths of Sheol or from the heights above.’ ‘No’, Ahaz answered ‘I will not put the Lord to the test.’ Then Isaiah said: ‘Listen now, House of David: are you not satisfied with trying the patience of men without trying the patience of my God, too? The Lord himself, therefore, will give you a sign. It is this: the maiden is with child and will soon give birth to a son whom she will call Immanuel, a name which means “God-is-with-us”.’

Responsorial Psalm

Ps 23:1-6. R. see vv 7. 10

Let the Lord enter; he is king of glory.

Second reading

Rom 1:1-7

From Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus who has been called to be an apostle, and specially chosen to preach the Good News that God promised long ago through his prophets in the scriptures. This news is about the Son of God, who, according to the human nature he took, was a descendant of David: it is about Jesus Christ our Lord who, in the order of the spirit, the spirit of holiness that was in him, was proclaimed Son of God in all his power through his resurrection from the dead. Through him we received grace and our apostolic mission to preach the obedience of faith to all pagan nations in honour of his name. You are one of these nations, and by his call belong to Jesus Christ. To you all, then, who are God’s beloved in Rome, called to be saints, may God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ send grace and peace.

Gospel

Mt 1:18-24

This is how Jesus Christ came to be born. His mother Mary was betrothed

to Joseph; but before they came to live together she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a man of honour and wanting to spare her publicity, decided to divorce her informally. He had made up his mind to do this when the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, ‘Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because she has conceived what is in her by the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son and you must name him Jesus, because he is the one who is to save his people from their sins.’ Now all this took place to fulfil the words spoken by the Lord through the prophet: *The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son and they will call him Emmanuel, a name which means ‘God-is-with-us’.* When Joseph woke up he did what the angel of the Lord had told him to do: he took his wife to his home.

Reflection: An Open Invitation

It is at Christmas that many people attend Mass for just their second time in the year. Some regular churchgoers view these people negatively and scoff at why they bother with the church if they can only make it twice a year. But others take the view that we need to do our best to make these people feel welcome at these times, in an effort to help open their hearts to perhaps engaging with the church more than they have. And I think it is the latter position that is the healthier. No one can be forced to believe; we all need to accept the invitation that Jesus gives us to be his followers. The gift of the real, true, and fulfilling life that Jesus offers is never going to be forced on us. We can choose to unwrap the gift, to put it in a corner to be considered for opening at a later time, or thrown out altogether. We can be Jesus’ helpers in offering his gift to people we know.



Perhaps there are neighbours, friends or family members who you know who have had a past association with the Church. Perhaps, just perhaps, they may have been waiting for an invitation to come back. Is there anyone you could invite along to Mass this Christmas with you?

The worst thing that can happen is that they might say ‘no.’ The best thing that can happen is that this invitation leads them to gradually accepting the gifts of Jesus and taking up the invitation to follow Him.
