First Reading

2 Kgs 5:14-17 Naaman the leper went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan. as Elisha had

told him to do. And his flesh became clean once more like the flesh of a little child. Returning to Elisha with his whole escort, he went in and stood before him. 'Now I know' he said, 'that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel. Now, please, accept a present from your servant.' But Elisha replied,

'As the Lord lives, whom I serve, I will accept nothing'. Naaman pressed him to accept, but he refused. Then Naaman said, 'Since your answer is "No," allow your servant to be given as much earth as two mules may carry, because your servant will no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any god except the Lord.'

Second Reading

2 Tm 2:8-13

Remember the Good News that I carry. 'Jesus Christ risen from the dead, sprung from the race of David'; it is on account of this that I have my own hardships to bear, even to being chained like a criminal – but they cannot chain up God's news. So I bear it all for the sake of those who are chosen, so that in the end they may have the salvation that is in Christ Jesus and the eternal glory that comes with it. Here is a saying that you can rely on: If we have died with him, then we shall live with him. If we hold firm, then we shall reign with him. If we disown him, then he will disown us. We may be unfaithful, but he is always faithful, for he cannot disown his own self.

Gospel

Lk 17:11-19

On the way to Jerusalem Jesus travelled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. As he entered one of the villages, ten lepers came to meet him. They stood some way off and called to him, 'Jesus! Master! Take pity on us.' When he saw them, he said, 'Go and show yourselves to the priests.' Now as they were going away they were cleansed. Finding himself cured, one of them turned back praising God at the top of his voice and threw himself at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. The man was a Samaritan. This made Jesus say, 'Were not all ten made clean? The other nine, where are they? It seems that no one has come back to give praise to God, except this foreigner.' And he said to the man, 'Stand up and go on your way. Your faith has saved you.'

Reflection: Where are they?

'The other nine, where are they?' asked Jesus. Why would the other nine not have come back to give thanks? It is insufficient to say that the miraculous healing these men experienced changed their lives. Being healed of this disease meant so much to them: they could return to their families; they could return to work; they could touch another person; they could walk among other people; they could join in prayer at the synagogue. As they hurried back toward town they must have been overwhelmed by the possibilities and opportunities that lay before them. But they neglected to acknowledge the source of their great joy! **Greg Sunter**

KAIROS PRISON MINISTRY LETTERS

As will be mentioned by Deacon Tony at Masses this weekend, to give a gift to others as we celebrate the feast of our patron, St Luke, we are asking our St Luke's Catholic Faith Community members to write one, or a few, letters to men who will hear the message of Jesus Christ during a course in one of our local prisons next month. This is a form of outreach – spreading the Good News of God's love for all and bringing hope to the hopeless. Some important points:

- *Each letter must be hand-written
- *No fancy paper is req, just use white A4. *Do not use any identification other than your first name

*Don't mention where you live or where you go to Church

*The message must be positive

*Do not mention anything about why they are in prison

If you are not sure how to write it, imagine that God was writing a letter of love to you and use these types of sentiments.

The sample letters below are just examples. Please don't use these exact words but use similar types of expressions.

It doesn't need to be long. Just two or three paragraphs of support and encouragement. Please either deliver these letters to 2 Springdale St, Marsden Park (just opposite the exit gate for the college car park) in the next week or so or bring them to Mass on the weekend when we celebrate our St Luke's Feast Day (October 22 and 23).

Sample Letter 1

Dear Friend,

I am so glad you decided to attend a Kairos course, giving you the opportunity to hear about God's love for you. God's Word, the Bible, tells us the wonderful news that God gave his son, Jesus Christ, to die a painful death for us. This great sacrifice took away our sins so that we can have eternal life in Heaven with him. He loves us all - you and me included. All we have to do is ask for his forgiveness and accept Him into our lives. How easy is that?

I hope and pray that you will want to know more about our living God's undying love that is always there for us.
