First Reading

Daniel 12:1-3 'At that time Michael will stand up, the great prince

who mounts guard over your people. There is going to be a time of great distress, unparalleled since nations first came into existence. When that time comes, your own people will be spared, all those whose names are found written in the Book. Of those who lie sleeping in the dust of the earth many will awake, some to everlasting life, some to shame and everlasting disgrace. The learned will shine as brightly as the vault of heaven, and those who have instructed many in virtue, as bright as stars for all eternity.'

Responsorial Psalm

Keep me safe, O God: you are my hope.

Second Reading

Hebrews 10:11-14, 18

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews By a single offering he has achieved the eternal perfection of those who are sanctified. All the priests stand at their duties every day, offering over and over again the same sacrifices which are quite incapable of taking sins away. Christ, on the other hand, has offered one single sacrifice for sins, and then taken his place for ever, at the right hand of God, where he is now waiting until his enemies are made into a footstool for him. By virtue of that one single offering, he has achieved the eternal perfection of all whom he is sanctifying. When all sins have been forgiven, there can be no more sin offerings.

Gospel

Mark 13:24-32

Jesus said to his disciples: 'In those days, after the time of distress, the sun will be darkened, the moon will lose its brightness, the stars will come falling from heaven and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in the clouds with great power and glory; then too he will send the angels to gather his chosen from the four winds, from the ends of the world to the ends of heaven. 'Take the fig tree as a parable: as soon as its twigs grow supple and its leaves

come out, you know that summer is near. So with you, when you see these things happening: know that he is near, at the very gates. I tell you solemnly, before this generation has passed away all these things will have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. 'But as for that day or hour, nobody knows it, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son; no one but the Father.'

Reflection – Francis Focus

As Pope Francis points out, the story Jesus tells in this week's Gospel passage is 'not a discourse on the end of the world, but rather an invitation to live the present well.' We are told 'to be vigilant and ever ready for when we will be called to account for our life.'

The Pope reminds us that Jesus is speaking about more than specifics. The dimming sun, darkening moon or falling stars need not be taken as literal descriptions of the future. Rather, Jesus is giving us a true prophetic insight: all created things will pass and Christ will gather his people in glory.

The key to this passage, as the Pope explains, is that human history has meaning through Christ. 'Human history, like the personal history of each of us,' he says, 'cannot be understood as a simple succession of meaningless words and facts.' What Jesus wants us to know, the Pope suggests, is 'that the history of peoples and that of individuals have a purpose and an aim to fulfil: the definitive encounter with the Lord.'

Therefore, as the Pope puts it, we should reflect on 'whether the Word of the Son of God has illuminated our personal existence, or whether we turned our back to it.' After all, it is when things seem gloomiest that we should turn towards the light.
