Sunday Reflection

In this passage, Jesus teaches about true blessing. He says that those who are poor, hungry, and sad are blessed, while those who are rich, comfortable, and well-liked should be careful. Jesus wants us to focus on what matters most—God and His kingdom.

Jesus blesses the poor, not just those without money but also those who know they need God. True riches come from trusting in Him. Many people who don't have much still find joy because they rely on God. We can learn from them by being grateful, content with what we have, and trusting that God will provide.



Jesus also blesses those who hunger and cry. This hunger is not just for food but for justice and goodness. He reminds us to ask ourselves: Do we truly desire God's will, or are we too focused on comfort? Those who struggle now will find joy in God's promises. We can live this out by standing up for what is right, comforting others in sadness, and sharing hope with those in need.

Then Jesus warns those who are rich, full, and praised by others. These things are not wrong, but they can make us forget about God. Jesus calls us to share what we have and not just seek more for ourselves. We can practice this by being generous—giving money, time, and kindness to others.

Another important lesson is that Jesus turns the world's values upside down. Success in God's kingdom is not about money or fame but about humility, kindness, and faithfulness. This means choosing to serve instead of seeking power and focusing on eternal rewards instead of temporary success.

This passage asks us to think about what truly matters. Are we chasing after worldly success, or are we living for God's kingdom? Let's trust in God's love, be generous, and stay faithful, knowing that real blessings come from Him.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

First Reading - Jeremiah 17:5-8

The Lord says this: 'A curse on the man who puts his trust in man, who relies on things of flesh, whose heart turns from the Lord. He is like dry scrub in the wastelands: if good comes, he has no eyes for it, he settles in the parched places of the wilderness, a salt land, uninhabited. 'A blessing on the man who puts his trust in the Lord, with the Lord for his hope. He is like a tree by the waterside that thrusts its roots to the stream: when the heat comes it feels no alarm, its foliage stays green; it has no worries in a year of drought, and never ceases to bear fruit.'

Responsorial Psalm - Ps 1:1-4. R. Ps 39:5

(R.) Happy are they who hope in the Lord.

Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 15:12, 16-20

If Christ raised from the dead is what has been preached, how can some of you be saying that there is no resurrection of the dead? For if the dead are not raised, Christ has not been raised, and if Christ has not been raised, you are still in your sins. And what is more serious, all who have died in Christ have perished. If our hope in Christ has been for this life only, we are the most unfortunate of all people. But Christ has in fact been raised from the dead, the first-fruits of all who have fallen asleep.

Gospel Acclamation - Luke 6:23

Alleluia, alleluia! Rejoice and be glad; your reward is great in heaven. Alleluia!

Gospel - Luke 6:17. 20-26

Jesus came down with the Twelve and stopped at a piece of level ground where there was a large gathering of his disciples with a great crowd of people from all parts of Judaea and from Jerusalem and from the coastal region of Tyre and Sidon who had come to hear him and to be cured of their diseases.

Then fixing his eyes on his disciples he said:

How happy are you who are poor: yours is the kingdom of God. Happy you who are hungry now: you shall be satisfied.

Happy you who weep now: you shall laugh.

'Happy are you when people hate you, drive you out, abuse you, denounce your name as criminal, on account of the Son of Man. Rejoice when that day comes and dance for joy, for then your reward will be great in heaven. This was the way their ancestors treated the prophets. 'But alas for you who are rich: you are having your consolation now. Alas for you who have your fill now: you shall go hungry. Alas for you who laugh now: you shall mourn and weep. 'Alas for you when the world speaks well of you! This was the way their ancestors treated the false prophets.'

To prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries, let us call to mind our sins,' says the celebrant at the penitential rite. Far from being a negative focus, the emphasis of this prayer is the infinite love of our compassionate God, personified in Jesus. In a healthy family, members are not afraid to recognize that they are always in need of forgiveness. Similarly, for our faith family, the penitential rite is one way of acknowledging that we always stand in need of reconciliation. This part of the Mass often includes the 'Kyrie eleison' ('Lord have mercy') which is one of the most ancient of Christian responses.


