Sunday Reflection

Dear one and all,

In Luke 6:27-38, Jesus presents a radical vision of love that goes beyond human instincts: "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you." This is not just an ethical teaching but an invitation to live in a way that reflects God's own mercy.

The world teaches us to treat others as they deserve, to return kindness with kindness and harm with harm. But Jesus calls us to something higher—to love even when it is undeserved. Imagine a colleague at work who undermines you. The usual response is to protect yourself or seek fairness. But what if, instead, you responded with grace, continuing to work with integrity and even showing kindness? Not because they deserve it, but because this is how God treats us.

At home, relationships can be strained. A sharp word from a spouse, sibling, or friend can make us want to lash out. Yet Jesus calls us to patience and blessing, not just because it keeps the peace, but because it mirrors how God responds to us. Forgiveness is never easy—it costs something. When we choose to forgive rather than retaliate, we absorb the cost instead of passing it on. This is exactly what Christ did for us—taking on the weight of our sins so that we might live in freedom.

Even in the wider community, we meet people who are rude or dismissive. A neighbor who refuses to acknowledge you, a stranger who is impatient. Our natural instinct is to ignore them or respond in kind. But Jesus calls us to act not based on what others deserve, but on who we are as children of God. "Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful." This mercy is not just a duty—it is a sign that we have been transformed by the mercy we ourselves have received.

Jesus promises that when we live this way, "A good measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over" will be given to us. This is not a promise of material reward but a deeper spiritual truth. The more we grasp God's grace, the more we experience the abundance of His kingdom. This week, as we navigate work, home, and community life, may we ask ourselves: how can I extend God's mercy today?

LITURGY OF THE WORD

Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

First Reading - 1 Samuel 26:2. 7-9. 12-13. 22-23

Saul set off and went down to the wilderness of Ziph, accompanied by three thousand men chosen from Israel to search for David in the wilderness of Ziph. So in the dark David and Abishai made their way towards the force, where they found Saul asleep inside the camp, his spear stuck in the ground beside his head, with Abner and the troops lying round him. Then Abishai said to David, 'Today God has put your enemy in your power; so now let me pin him to the ground with his own spear. Just one stroke! I will not need to strike him twice. David answered Abishai, Do not kill him, for who can lift his hand against the Lord's anointed and be without guilt?' David took the spear and the pitcher of water from beside Saul's head, and they made off. No one saw, no one knew, no one woke up; they were all asleep, for a deep sleep from the Lord had fallen on them. David crossed to the other side and halted on the top of the mountain a long way off; there was a wide space between them. David then called out, 'Here is the king's spear. Let one of the soldiers come across and take it. The Lord repays everyone for his uprightness and loyalty. Today the Lord put you in my power, but I would not raise my hand against the Lord's anointed.'

Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 15:45-49

If The first man, Adam, as scripture says, became a living soul; but the last Adam has become a life-giving spirit. That is, first the one with the soul, not the spirit, and after that, the one with the spirit. The first man, being from the earth, is earthly by nature; the second man is from heaven. As this earthly man was, so are we on earth; and as the heavenly

man is, so are we in heaven. And we, who have been modelled on the earthly man, will be modelled on the heavenly man.

Alleluia, alleluia! I give you a new commandment; love one another as I have loved you. Alleluia!

Gospel - Luke 6:27-38

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I say this to you who are listening: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who treat you badly. To the man who slaps you on one cheek, present the other cheek too; to the man who takes your cloak from you, do not refuse your tunic. Give to everyone who asks you, and do not ask for your property back from the man who robs you. Treat others as you would like them to treat you. If you love those who love you, what thanks can you expect? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what thanks can you expect? For even sinners do that much. And if you lend to those from whom you hope to receive, what thanks can you expect? Even sinners lend to sinners to get back the same amount. Instead, love your enemies and do good, and lend without any hope of return. You will have a great reward, and you will be sons of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked.

'Be compassionate as your Father is compassionate. Do not judge, and you will not be judged yourselves; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned yourselves; grant pardon, and you will be pardoned. Give, and there will be gifts for you: a full measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over, will be poured into your lap; because the amount you measure out is the amount you will be given back.'

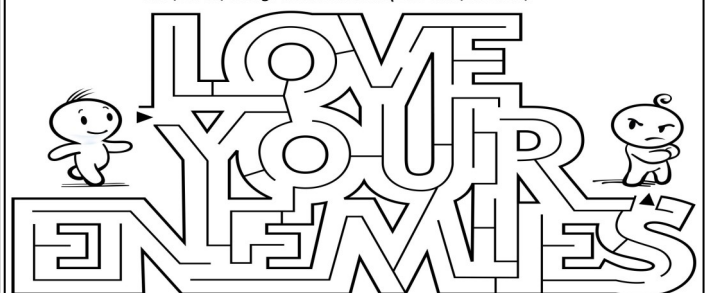
PARISH LENTEN PROGRAM

Why do we sign ourselves before the Gospel?



The Church distinguishes between the 'large' sign of the cross (made with right hand outstretched on forehead, chest and shoulders) and the 'small' sign of the cross (made with the thumb on forehead, mouth and chest). With this latter action just prior to the reading of the Gospel, we are asking God's blessing upon our thoughts, words and desires. Next time you make this sign, be aware that you are praying to open yourself to God's Word.
