



Sunday Reflection

16TH MARCH 2025

The Transfiguration in Luke 9:28-36 reveals both the glory of Jesus and the necessity of the cross. As Jesus prays, His appearance changes, His clothes become dazzling white, and He is joined by Moses and Elijah, who speak with Him about His "departure"—a word that also means "exodus." This is a profound moment where Jesus is shown as the fulfillment of both the Law and the Prophets. Peter, overwhelmed, suggests building shelters to preserve the moment, but a cloud overshadows them, and the voice of God declares. "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to Him!" The vision ends, leaving only Jesus before them.



The timing of the Transfiguration is significant. Jesus has just begun teaching His disciples that He must suffer, die, and rise again. This moment on the mountain is a reassurance that His path of suffering is not a failure but part of God's redemptive plan. The disciples want to stay in the glory, but Jesus leads them back down, because faith is not about escaping hardship but learning to trust in the midst of it.

Lent mirrors this journey. It is a season where we, like the disciples, are called to recognize both the cost and the promise of following Christ. The mention of Jesus' "exodus" connects to Israel's deliverance from slavery, reminding us that Lent is about our own exodus from sin, selfishness, and spiritual complacency. Transformation comes not from avoiding suffering but from walking through it with trust in God.

The Father's command to "listen to Him" is a reminder that true change happens when we hear and obey Christ's voice. In a world filled with distractions, Lent calls us to set aside time for prayer, Scripture, and self-examination. The Transfiguration points us forward to the resurrection, assuring us that suffering is never the end of the story. As we journey through Lent, we follow Jesus not just to the cross, but through it, trusting that beyond sacrifice lies the glory of new life.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

Second Sunday of Lent Year C

First Reading - Genesis 15:5-12. 17-18

Taking Abram outside the Lord said, 'Look up to heaven and count the stars if you can. Such will be your descendants' he told him. Abram put his faith in the Lord, who counted this as making him justified. 'I am the Lord' he said to him 'who brought you out of Ur of the Chaldaeans to make you heir to this land.' 'My Lord, the Lord' Abram replied, 'how am I to know that I shall inherit it?' He said to him, 'Get me a three-year-old heifer, a three-year-old goat, a threeyear-old ram, a turtledove and a young pigeon.' He brought him all these, cut them in half and put half on one side and half facing it on the other; but the birds he did not cut in half. Birds of prey came down on the carcasses but Abram drove them off. Now as the sun was setting Abram fell into a deep sleep, and terror seized him. When the sun had set and darkness had fallen, there appeared a smoking furnace and a firebrand that went between the halves. That day the Lord made a Covenant with Abram in these terms: 'To your descendants I give this land, from the wadi of Egypt to the Great River.'

Responsorial Psalm - Ps 26:1. 7-9. 13-14. R. v.1

(R.) The Lord is my light and my salvation.

Second Reading - Philippians 3:17 - 4:1

My brothers, be united in following my rule of life. Take as your models everybody who is already doing this and study them as you used to study us. I have told you often, and I repeat it today with tears, there are many who are behaving as the enemies of the cross of Christ. They are destined to be lost. They make foods into their god and they are proudest of something they ought to think shamful;

the things they think important are earthly things. For us, our homeland is in heaven, and from heaven comes the saviour we are waiting for, the Lord Jesus Christ, and he will transfigure these wretched bodies of ours into copies of his glorious body. He will do that by the same power with which he can subdue the whole universe. So then, my brothers and dear friends, do not give way but remain faithful in the Lord. I miss you very much, dear friends; you are my joy and my crown.

Gospel Acclamation - Matthew 17:5

Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ! From the shining cloud the Father's voice is heard: this is my beloved Son, hear him. Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!

Gospel - Luke 6:39-45

Jesus took with him Peter and John and James and went up the mountain to pray. As he prayed, the aspect of his face was changed and his clothing became brilliant as lightning. Suddenly there were two men there talking to him; they were Moses and Elijah appearing in glory, and they were speaking of his passing which he was to accomplish in Jerusalem. Peter and his companions were heavy with sleep, but they kept awake and saw his glory and the two men standing with him. As these were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' – He did not know what he was saying. As he spoke, a cloud came and covered them with shadow; and when they went into the cloud the disciples were afraid. And a voice came from the cloud saying, 'This is my Son, the Chosen One. Listen to him.' And after the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. The disciples kept silence and, at that time, told no one what they had seen.
