Sunday Reflection

In today's Gospel, Jesus responds to a lawyer's question: "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" The answer begins simply: love God with all your heart, soul, strength, and mind—and love your neighbour as yourself. But then comes the follow-up question, "And who is my neighbour?" That's when Jesus tells the story of the Good Samaritan.

A man is left half-dead on the side of the road. A priest and a Levite—religious leaders who should have been the most compassionate—walk by, perhaps too busy, perhaps afraid, perhaps rationalising that it wasn't their responsibility. Then comes the Samaritan, someone considered an outsider, even an enemy, by the Jewish people. But he's the one who stops, tends the wounds, pays the cost, and promises to return.

This parable is more than a lesson in kindness; it's a challenge to our instincts about who "deserves" our compassion. True love for neighbour means moving toward need, not away from it—even when it's costly, inconvenient, or crosses boundaries we've built.

Notice also the shift in Jesus' question at the end. He doesn't ask, "Who is your neighbour?" but "Which of these was a neighbour?" The point is not about identifying who qualifies as a neighbour; the real question is: Are you becoming a neighbour to others?

The parable disrupts the neat categories we often use to define morality. It's not about religious performance, but radical mercy. It invites us to imagine what our communities, churches, and streets

might look like if we became people who constantly crossed barriers with compassion.

In a way, the Samaritan reflects what God has done for us: seeing our brokenness, He moved toward us, healed us at great cost to Himself, and promised never to leave us. When we truly grasp that, we'll stop asking, "What must I do?" and start asking, "How can I become this kind of person?"

This week, let's not pass by. Let's see, stop, and serve. That's what it means to love our neighbour—and to live.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

First Reading - Deuteronomy 30:10-14 $^{\sim}$ Moses said to the people: 'Obey the voice of the Lord your God, keeping those commandments and laws of his that are written in the Book of this Law, and you shall return to the Lord your God with all your heart and soul. 'For this Law that I enjoin on you today is not beyond your strength or beyond your reach. It is not in heaven, so that you need to wonder, "Who will go up to heaven for us and bring it down to us, so that we may hear it and keep it?" Nor is it beyond the seas, so that you need to wonder, "Who will cross the seas for us and bring it back to us, so that we may hear it and keep it?" No, the Word is very near to you, it is in your mouth and in your heart for your observance.'

Responsorial Psalm - Ps 68:14. 17. 30-31. 33-34. 36-37. R. see v.33 (R) Turn to the Lord in your need, and you will live.

Second Reading - Colossians 1:15-20 $^{\circ}$ Christ Jesus is the image of the unseen God and the first-born of all creation, for in him were created all things in heaven and on earth: everything visible and everything invisible, Thrones, Dominations, Sovereignties, Powers $^{\circ}$ all things were created through him and for him. Before anything was created, he existed, and he holds all things in unity. Now the Church is his body, he is its head. As he is the Beginning, he was first to be born from the dead, so that he should be first in every way; because God wanted all perfection to be found in him and all things to be reconciled through him and for him, everything in heaven and everything on earth, when he made peace by his death on the cross.

Gospel Acclamation (See John 6:63. 68) ~ Alleluia, alleluia! Your words, Lord, are spirit and life; you have the words of everlasting life. Alleluia!

Gospel - Luke 10:25-37 ~ There was a lawyer who, to disconcert Jesus, stood up and said to him, 'Master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' He said to him, 'What is written in the Law? What do you read there?' He replied, You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbour as yourself.' 'You have answered right,' said Jesus, 'do this and life is yours.' But the man was anxious to justify himself and said to Jesus, 'And who is my neighbour?' Jesus replied, 'A man was once on his way down from Jerusalem to Jericho and fell into the hands of brigands; they took all he had, beat him and then made off, leaving him half dead. Now a priest happened to be travelling down the same road, but when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. In the same way a Levite who came to the place saw him, and passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan traveller who came upon him was moved with compassion when he saw him. He went up and bandaged his wounds, pouring oil and wine on them. He then lifted him on to his own mount, carried him to the inn and looked after him. Next day, he took out two denarii and handed them to the innkeeper. "Look after him," he said, "and on my way back I will make good any extra expense you have." Which of these three, do you think, proved himself a neighbour to the man who fell into the brigands' hands?' 'The one who took pity on him,' he replied. Jesus said to him, 'Go and do the same yourself.'


CONDOLENCES
