Sunday Reflection

In Luke 14:1, 7-14, Jesus is invited to a meal at the home of a about recognizing that our Pharisee. While there, He notices how people are quick to choose the best seats for themselves. He takes this moment to where we sit at the table, but teach about humility, saying that when you are invited, don't rush from the One who invited us. to the places of honor. He ends with the in God's love, we don't need principle: "For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted."

Jesus then turns to the host and challenges him as well. Don't just invite friends, family, or wealthy neighbors who can repay Jesus Himself lived this teaching. He took the lowest place, you. Instead, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind—those who cannot pay you back. In doing so, your reward will come from God.

The heart of this passage is not just about table manners, but about the posture of our hearts. We often live by a system of self -promotion and reciprocity—seeking recognition, climbing social ladders, and expecting returns for our generosity. Jesus confronts this way of living. True greatness in God's kingdom is not about status but about humility and selfless love.

Humility here is not about putting ourselves down, but about lifting others up. It's worth doesn't come from to compete for honor. We are



freed to serve and to give without calculating what we'll get in

washing His disciples' feet, giving His life on the cross for people who could never repay Him. In Him, we see that the way down is the way up.

This passage invites us to reflect: How do I approach others? Do I give and love only when there's something in it for me? Or am I learning to love freely, trusting that God Himself will honor and reward me? The kingdom belongs to those who choose humility, generosity, and the joy of serving others.

You have come to God himself, the supreme Judge, and been placed with spirits of the saints who have been made perfect; and to Jesus, the mediator who brings a new covenant.

Gospel - Luke 14:1. 7-14 ~ and they watched him closely. He then told First Reading - Sirach 3:17-20, 28-29 ~ My son, be gentle in carrying the guests a parable, because he had noticed how they picked the places of honour. He said this, 'When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour. A more distinguished person than you may have been invited, and the person who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your place to this man." And then, to your embarrassment, you would have to go and take the lowest place. No; when you are a guest, make your way to the lowest place and sit there, so that, when your host comes, he may say, "My friend, move up higher." In that way, everyone with you at the table will see you honoured. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the man who humbles himself will be exalted.'

> Then he said to his host, 'When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not ask your friends, brothers, relations or rich neighbours, for fear they repay your courtesy by inviting you in return. No; when you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind; that they cannot pay you back means that you are fortunate, because repayment will be made to you when the virtuous rise again.'
