Sunday Reflection...

In Luke 16:19-31, the story of the rich man and Lazarus challenges us to reflect on how we use our resources, time, and influence to serve others. Wealth and comfort are not wrong in themselves, but they carry a responsibility to act with compassion. Ignoring the needs around us, like the rich man ignoring Lazarus, can lead to emptiness and regret. Acts such as offering time, sharing resources, listening, or advocating for someone demonstrate love and mercy in action.

The story also highlights the importance of awareness and empathy. It is easy to become absorbed in our own lives and concerns, yet this parable reminds us to look beyond ourselves. Noticing need—whether in family, workplace, or community—can guide our decisions. Sometimes this requires adjusting priorities, giving up comfort, or stepping out of routine to care for others.

Spiritual vigilance is another key theme. The rich man had access to God's word through Moses and the prophets, yet he did not respond. Engaging with God's teachings and allowing them

to shape our lives ensures that faith is more than knowledge—it becomes action. Daily choices, small or significant, reflect our character and alignment with God's ways.

The story calls us to live with an eternal perspective. Recognizing that actions have lasting impact encourages us to prioritize what truly matters—love, mercy, and justice—over accumulation or self-interest. Serving others, showing compassion, and cultivating gratitude and humility reflect a life aligned with God's will.

This parable invites us to see, respond, and serve, shaping our lives around the principles of God's kingdom. By embracing love and mercy, integrating God's guidance into everyday life, and valuing eternal truths over temporary comforts, we live in a way that bears fruit both for ourselves and those around us, creating a meaningful and lasting impact.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

Entrance Antiphon: Daniel 3:31,29,30,43,42: ~ All that you have done to us, O Lord, you have done with true judgement, for we have sinned against you and not obeyed your commandments. But give glory to your name and deal with us according to the bounty of your mercy.

First Reading - Amos 6:1. 4-7 ~ The almighty Lord says this: Woe to those ensconced so snugly in Zion and to those who feel so safe on the mountain of Samaria. Lying on ivory beds and sprawling on their divans, they dine on lambs from the flock, and stall-fattened veal; they bawl to the sound of the harp, they invent new instruments of music like David, they drink wine by the bowlful, and use the finest oil for anointing themselves, but about the ruin of Joseph they do not care at all. That is why they will be the first to be exiled; the sprawlers' revelry is over.

Responsorial Psalm - Ps 145:6-10. R. v.2

(R.) Praise the Lord, my soul!

Second Reading - 1 Timothy 6:11-16 ~ As a man dedicated to God, you must aim to be saintly and religious, filled with faith and love, patient and gentle. Fight the good fight of the faith and win for yourself the eternal life to which you were called when you made your profession and spoke up for the truth in front of many witnesses. Now, before God the source of all life and before Jesus Christ, who spoke up as a witness for the truth in front of Pontius Pilate, I put to you the duty of doing all that you have been told, with no faults or failures, until the Appearing of our Lord Jesus Christ, who at the due time will be revealed by God, the blessed and only Ruler of all, the King of kings and the Lord of lords, who alone is immortal, whose home is in inaccessible light, whom no man has seen and no man is able to see: to him be honour and everlasting power. Amen.

Gospel Acclamation ~ 2 Corinthians 8:9 ~ Alleluia, alleluia! Jesus Christ was rich but he became poor, to make you rich out of his poverty. Alleluia!

Gospel ~ Luke 16:19-31 ~ Jesus said to the Pharisees: 'There was a rich man who used to dress in purple and fine linen and feast magnificently every day. And at his gate there lay a poor man called Lazarus, covered with sores, who longed to fill himself with the scraps that fell from the rich man's table. Dogs even came and licked his sores. Now the poor man died and was carried away by angels to the bosom of Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried. 'In his torment in Hades he looked up and saw Abraham a long way off with Lazarus in his bosom. So he cried out, "Father Abraham, pity me and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am in agony in these flames." "My son," Abraham replied "remember that during your life good things came your way, just as bad things came the way of Lazarus. Now he is being comforted here while you are in agony. But that is not all: between us and you a great gulf has been fixed, to stop anyone, if he wanted to, crossing from our side to yours, and to stop any crossing from your side to ours." 'The rich man replied, "Father, I beg you then to send Lazarus to my father's house, since I have five brothers, to give them warning, so that they do not come to this place of torment too." "They have Moses and the prophets," said Abraham "let them listen to them." "Ah no, father Abraham," said the rich man "but if someone comes to them from the dead, they will repent." Then Abraham said to him, "If they will not listen either to Moses or to the prophets, they will not be convinced even if someone should rise from the dead."

Why do we have sacraments?

Relationships grow through communication. We communicate in many ways beyond words: smiles, handshakes, gestures of affection, gifts, cards, flowers. In our relationship with God, too, we use signs to express the mystery of God's loving presence. There are many ways we do this, but some community rituals have developed in our Church which we hold to be particularly sacred and which mark the various stages of a person's life as a member of the Church. 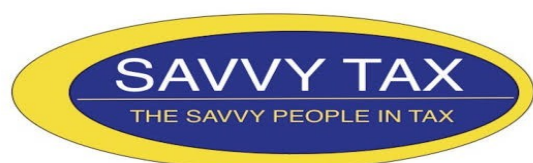
