Sunday Reflection....

In Luke 17:11-19, Jesus heals ten men who had leprosy, but only one comes back to say thank you. This story teaches us an important lesson: we are called to come to God with thankful hearts.

The ten men were very sick. Their illness kept them away from family, friends, and community, and their lives were full of loneliness and difficulty. When they called to Jesus for help, they showed faith and trust. They followed His instructions to go show themselves to the priests, and as they went, they were trusting and acting on God's word.

Only one man returned to give thanks. He noticed not just his healing but also God's love and care for him. Gratitude is more than saying words; it is recognizing God's blessings and re- Let us remember to come to God with thanks, not just when we sponding with a thankful heart. True joy and satisfaction come when we take time to thank God, not just when we receive some- and love. . thina.

In our own lives, it is easy to forget to be thankful. We may receive help from others, enjoy good health, or experience happy

moments, but we move on without pausing to give thanks. Like the nine men who did not return, we can miss the deeper joy that comes from gratitude. Coming to God with thanks changes our hearts. It opens our eyes to God's presence and fills us with peace, happiness, and contentment.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

Twenty- Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

Entrance Antiphon: Psalm 129:3-4: ~ If you, O Lord, should mark iniquities, Lord, who could stand? But with you is found forgiveness, O God of Israel.

First Reading - 2 Kings 5:14-17 $^{\sim}$ Naaman the leper went down and immersed himself seven times in the Jordan, as Elisha had told him to do. And his flesh became clean once more like the flesh of a little child. Returning to Elisha with his whole escort, he went in and stood before him. 'Now I know' he said, 'that there is no God in all the earth except in Israel. Now, please, accept a present from your servant.' But Elisha replied, 'As the Lord lives, whom I serve, I will accept nothing.' Naaman pressed him to accept, but he refused. Then Naaman said, 'Since your answer is "No," allow your servant to be given as much earth as two mules may carry, because your servant will no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any god except the Lord.'

Responsorial Psalm - Ps 97:1-4. R. see v.2

(R.) The Lord has revealed to the nations his saving power.

Second Reading - 2 Timothy 2:8-13 \sim Remember the Good News that I carry. 'Jesus Christ risen from the dead, sprung from the race of David'; it is on account of this that I have my own hardships to bear, even to being chained like a criminal – but they cannot chain up God's news. So I bear it all for the sake of those who are chosen,

so that in the end they may have the salvation that is in Christ Jesus and the eternal glory that comes with it. Here is a saying that you can rely on: If we have died with him, then we shall live with him. If we hold firm, then we shall reign with him. If we disown him, then he will disown us. We may be unfaithful, but he is always faithful, for he cannot disown his own self.

Gospel Acclamation ~ **1 Thessalonians 5:18** ~ Alleluia, alleluia! For all things give thanks to God, because this is what he expects of you in Christ Jesus. Alleluia!

Gospel ~ Luke 17:11-19 ~ On the way to Jerusalem Jesus travelled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. As he entered one of the villages, ten lepers came to meet him. They stood some way off and called to him, 'Jesus! Master! Take pity on us.' When he saw them he said, 'Go and show yourselves to the priests.' Now as they were going away they were cleansed. Finding himself cured, one of them turned back praising God at the top of his voice and threw himself at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. The man was a Samaritan. This made Jesus say, 'Were not all ten made clean? The other nine, where are they? It seems that no one has come back to give praise to God, except this foreigner.' And he said to the man, 'Stand up and go on your way. Your faith has saved you.'

HONOURING THE REAL PRESENCE OF CHRIST

As you know, we have been celebrating Mass in the hall, which is not a church building and does not have the Blessed Sacrament reserved. Soon we will be moving into our new church, where the tabernacle with the Blessed Sacrament will be present. As a sign of reverence, we genuflect (or bow if unable) when entering and leaving the church, acknowledging the Real Presence of Christ. We encourage everyone to be mindful of this important gesture of respect and devotion as we prepare to move into our new sacred space.

BLESSING AND OPENING OF OUR CHURCH BUILDING ~ The Blessing and Opening of our Church Building will take place next Sunday, 19 October, following the 10 am Mass. As this day celebrates the Feast of St Luke, our patron, Mass will begin with a procession. Bishop Vincent will be the main celebrant of both the Mass and the blessing, with other invited guests taking part in the ceremony. The congregation will witness the blessing and opening from the school's undercover area outside, surrounding the church building site. All are warmly invited to morning tea, and parishioners will have an opportunity to visit and pray in the church building after the blessing. Our first weekend Masses in the new church will be celebrated on the weekend of 25/26 October.

'Why go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation?' people sometimes ask. 'Isn't it enough to say sorry to God in my heart?' The Catholic approach to Reconciliation is deeply community-oriented. For us, sin is never a private affair. When one member of the body of Christ hurts, the whole body suffers. Imagine a husband and wife who harshly criticize each other. They can regret their words and say sorry to God. But for the forgiveness of God to really take effect in their marriage, they also need to reconcile with one another. 
