## Sunday Reflection....

The disciples ask Jesus to increase their faith, and He responds with a simple yet profound lesson about the nature of faith and service. Faith is not about grand gestures or extraordinary powers; it is about trust and obedience in the everyday moments of life. Faith is like a mustard seed—small, seemingly insignificant, yet capable of remarkable things when placed in the right context. This reminds us that our faith does not have to be overwhelming or perfect. Even a small measure of trust in God can transform our perspective, influence our choices, and guide our actions in meaningful ways.

The lesson also challenges our understanding of service. Jesus describes a servant who does everything asked of him without expecting special recognition. This illustrates that living faithfully often means doing the ordinary tasks well, without seeking praise or reward. In our daily lives, this could look like showing kindness to a co-worker, helping a neighbor, patiently listening to a family member, or offering encouragement to someone struggling. These acts may seem small or routine, but they reflect a heart aligned with God's will and make a tangible difference in the lives of others.

Practically, this encourages us to focus less on comparing ourselves to others or worrying that our efforts are inadequate. Instead,

we can start with what is in front of us—our work, relationships, and responsibilities—and carry them out with faithfulness and humility. Even small, consistent acts of love and obedience can have ripple effects we may never fully see.

We are also reminded that faith is not measured by what we accomplish but by our willingness to trust and obey. Like the mustard seed, it starts small but can grow and pro-

duce lasting change in our lives and the lives of others.

In everyday life, this means asking God for the patience, humility, and trust to live faithfully in ordinary circumstances. It is a call to let

even the smallest acts can become powerful expressions of faith, hope, and love.

This reflection invites us to consider how we carry out our daily responsibilities and encourages us to see every task, no matter how humble, as an opportunity to live faithfully and grow spiritually.

#### LITURGY OF THE WORD

### Twenty-seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C

**Entrance Antiphon:** Cf Esther 4:17: ~ Within your will, O Lord, all things are established, and there is none that can resist your will. For you have made all things, the heaven and the earth, and all that is held within the circle of heaven; you are the Lord of all.

First Reading - Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4~ The How long, Lord, am I to cry for help while you will not listen; to cry 'Oppression!' in your ear and you will not save? Why do you set injustice before me, why do you look on where there is tyranny? Outrage and violence, this is all I see, all is contention, and discord flourishes. Then the Lord answered and said,

'Write the vision down, inscribe it on tablets to be easily read, since this vision is for its own time only: eager for its own fulfilment, it does not deceive; if it comes slowly, wait, for come it will, without fail. See how he flags, he whose soul is not at rights, but the upright man will live by his faithfulness.'

(R.) If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.

**Second Reading - 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14** ~ I am reminding you to fan into a flame the gift that God gave you when I laid my hands on you. God's gift was not a spirit of timidity, but the Spirit of power, and love, and self-control. So you are never to be ashamed of witnessing to the Lord, or ashamed of me for being his prisoner; but

with me, bear the hardships for the sake of the Good News, relying on the power of God.

Keep as your pattern the sound teaching you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. You have been trusted to look after something precious; guard it with the help of the Holy Spirit who lives in us.

**Gospel Acclamation** ~ 1 **Peter 1:25** ~ Alleluia, alleluia! The word of the Lord stands for ever; it is the word given to you, the Good News. Alleluia!

Gospel ~ Luke 17:5-10 ~ The apostles said to the Lord, 'Increase our faith.' The Lord replied, 'Were your faith the size of a mustard seed you could say to this mulberry tree, "Be uprooted and planted in the sea", and it would obey you. 'Which of you, with a servant ploughing or minding sheep, would say to him when he returned from the fields, "Come and have your meal immediately"? Would he not be more likely to say, "Get my supper laid; make yourself tidy and wait on me while I eat and drink. You can eat and drink yourself afterwards"? Must he be grateful to the servant for doing what he was told? So with you: when you have done all you have been told to do, say, "We are merely servants: we have done no more than our duty."

#### WHY WE DO THE THINGS WE DO?

Part IV. Signs & Sacraments ~ Why do we baptize?

An adult baptized into the Church enters into a relationship. He or she no longer lives as an individual entity but as a member of the body of Christ. Like a wedding, the baptismal ceremony marks the beginning of this new life of union and ongoing commitment. A baptized person says 'Yes, I want to be one with you; I want to live a life faithful to the Gospel'. (When an infant is baptized, the parents and godparents make this commitment on the child's behalf.) Likewise, the community pledges itself to be one with that person. Two other rituals, Confirmation and Eucharist, complete this process whereby a person becomes part of the Catholic Church. Together the three are known as the Sacraments of Initiation.
