Sunday Reflection....

As we begin the first week of Advent, today's Gospel reminds us that the coming of the Son of Man will happen unexpectedly, just like in the days of Noah. Life often feels normal and predictable, and it's easy to think we have plenty of time to prepare for what really matters. But this passage asks us to pay attention—to live with awareness of God and what He wants for our lives. It reminds us that the future is not entirely in our control, and we cannot put off preparing our hearts. Advent calls us to live intentionally, staying ready for God's coming at any moment.

The story of Noah isn't just about a flood long ago; it is a mirror for our own lives. People were eating, drinking, marrying, and going about their usual routines, not knowing that everything could change suddenly. This shows us how easily we can be caught up in daily routines and forget to live with purpose. We are challenged to live with readiness, not out of fear, but by focusing on God, our relationships, and the life we are building each day. How we spend our time, the values we embrace, and the choices we make all shape whether we are truly ready to welcome God when He comes.

Being ready means noticing God in the ordinary moments of life—at work, at meals with family, while traveling, or in conversations with friends and neighbors. It means acting with honesty, kindness, and love, even when no one is watching. True preparedness is not about completing a list of rules or tasks; it is measured by how faithfully we live and how much love we show. Ad-

vent invites us to stay alert, to live with hearts open to God, ready to welcome Him whether in quiet, small ways or in moments that change everything.

This week, the message is simple: live with attention, love intentionally, and make daily choices that reflect hope and faith. We cannot predict the future, but we can live each day as if God could arrive at any moment. When we do, our lives shaped by faith and love will make us ready to meet Him with joy and confidence.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Sunday of Advent Year A

Entrance Antiphon: Cf Psalm 24:1-3 ~ To you, I lift up my soul, O my God. In you, I have trusted; let me not be put to shame. Nor let my enemies exult over me; and let none who hope in you be put to shame.

First Reading - Isaiah 2:1-5 ~ The vision of Isaiah son of Amoz, concerning Judah and Jerusalem. In the days to come the mountain of the Temple of the Lord shall tower above the mountains and be lifted higher than the hills. All the nations will stream to it, peoples without number will come to it; and they will say: 'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the Temple of the God of Jacob that he may teach us his ways so that we may walk in his paths; since the Law will go out from Zion, and the oracle of the Lord from Jerusalem.' He will wield authority over the nations and adjudicate between many peoples; these will hammer their swords into ploughshares, their spears into sickles. Nation will not lift sword against nation, there will be no more training for war. O House of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord.

Responsorial Psalm -Ps 121:1-2. 4-5. 6-9. R. see v.1.

(R.) Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

Second Reading - Romans 13:11-14 ~ You know 'the time' has come: you must wake up now: our salvation is even nearer than it was when we were converted. The night is almost over, it will be daylight soon -

let us give up all the things we prefer to do under the cover of the dark; let us arm ourselves and appear in the light. Let us live decently as people do in the daytime: no drunken orgies, no promiscuity or licentiousness, and no wrangling or jealousy. Let your armour be the Lord Jesus Christ.

Gospel Acclamation - Psalm 84:8 ~ Alleluia, alleluia! Lord, show us your mercy and love, and grant us your salvation. Alleluia!

Gospel - Matthew 24:37-44 ~ Jesus said to his disciples: 'As it was in Noah's day, so will it be when the Son of Man comes. For in those days before the Flood people were eating, drinking, taking wives, taking husbands, right up to the day Noah went into the ark, and they suspected nothing till the Flood came and swept all away. It will be like this when the Son of Man comes. Then of two men in the fields one is taken, one left; of two women at the millstone grinding, one is taken, one left.

'So stay awake, because you do not know the day when your master is coming. You may be quite sure of this that if the householder had known at what time of the night the burglar would come, he would have stayed awake and would not have allowed anyone to break through the wall of his house. Therefore, you too must stand ready because the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.'

Communion Antiphon - Psalm 84:13 ~ The Lord will bestow his bounty, and our earth shall yield its increase.



Part IV. Signs & Sacraments ~ Why do Catholics have a Pope?

In any organization, community or family, there is usually somebody whose presence gives the group cohesion and direction. This person might exert such influence in a specified role such as the managing director of a company, or less formally, as a parent around whom family activities revolve. For Catholics, the Pope fulfils a unique role as a sign



and guardian of the unity of our faith community. The title 'Pope' comes from the Greek 'papas' and Latin 'papa' meaning 'father'. As the bishop of Rome and the successor of St Peter, he is regarded as the representative of Christ the Good Shepherd.
