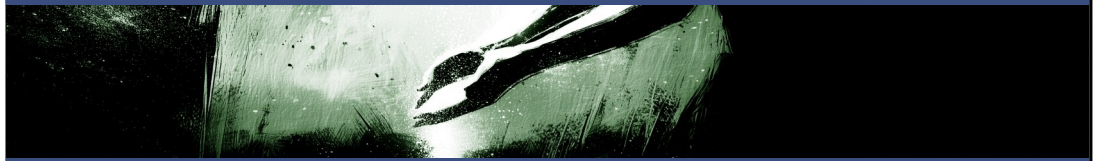

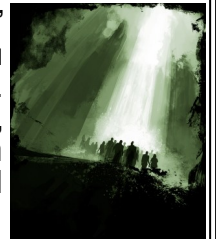
Sunday Reflection...

Jesus says we are the salt of the earth and the light of the world. These are ordinary images from everyday life, but they carry a deep challenge. Salt is small and easily overlooked, yet it changes everything it touches. Light is quiet and steady, yet it makes it possible to see and live.

Salt does not exist for itself. It only makes sense when it is mixed into food. In the same way, faith is not meant to be kept separate from real life. It is not something we store away for private moments only. Our faith is personal, but never private. It shapes how we speak, how we forgive, how we work, and how we treat people who cannot give us anything in return. When salt loses its taste, Jesus says it becomes useless. This is not about being loud or perfect, but about being real. When faith no longer affects how we live, it stops being life-giving.

Light does not draw attention to itself. It points beyond itself so others can see. A lamp is not lit to be admired, but to help people find their way. Our lives are not meant to be a performance. We are not called to impress others with how good or religious we are. We are called to live so people glimpse something greater than us. The focus is not on the light, but on what the light reveals.

Jesus does not say, "Try to become salt" or "Work hard to be light." He says, "You are." This is an identity before it is a task. We live this way not to earn God's love, but because we already live in it. When we know we are loved, forgiven, and held by God, something changes in us.



The world does not need more noise or show. It needs people who live with integrity, mercy, and hope. Small acts of kindness, steady faithfulness, honesty when it costs us something, and compassion that keeps showing up—these are the ways salt and light do their work. Through them, God is glorified in the world.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR A

Entrance Antiphon: Psalm 94:6-7 ~ O come, let us worship God and bow low before the God who made us, for he is the Lord our God.

First Reading - Isaiah 58:7-10 ~ Thus says the Lord: Share your bread with the hungry, and shelter the homeless poor, clothe the man you see to be naked and turn not from your own kin. Then will your light shine like the dawn and your wound be quickly healed over. Your integrity will go before you and the glory of the Lord behind you. Cry, and the Lord will answer; call, and he will say, 'I am here.' If you do away with the yoke, the clenched fist, the wicked word, if you give your bread to the hungry, and relief to the oppressed, your light will rise in the darkness, and your shadows become like noon.

Responsorial Psalm - Ps 111:4-9. R. v.4

(R.) A light rises in the darkness for the upright.

Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 2:1-5 ~ When I came to you, brothers, it was not with any show of oratory or philosophy, but simply to tell you what God had guaranteed. During my stay with you, the only knowledge I claimed to have was about Jesus, and only about him as the crucified Christ. Far from relying on any power of my own, I came among you in

great 'fear and trembling' and in my speeches and the sermons that I gave, there were none of the arguments that belong to philosophy; only a demonstration of the power of the Spirit. And I did this so that your faith should not depend on human philosophy but on the power of God.

Gospel Acclamation - John 8:12 ~ Alleluia, alleluia! I am the light of the world, says the Lord; the man who follows me will have the light of life. Alleluia!

Gospel - Matthew 5:13-16

~ Jesus said to his disciples: 'You are the salt of the earth. But if salt becomes tasteless, what can make it salty again? It is good for nothing, and can only be thrown out to be trampled underfoot by men.

'You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill-top cannot be hidden. No one lights a lamp to put it under a tub; they put it on the lamp-stand where it shines for everyone in the house. In the same way your light must shine in the sight of men, so that, seeing your good works, they may give the praise to your Father in heaven.'

Communion Antiphon - Cf Psalm 106:8-9 ~ Let them thank the Lord for his mercy, his wonders for the children of men, for he satisfies the thirsty soul, and the hungry he fills with good things.

WHY WE DO THE THINGS WE DO?

Part V. OCIA formally RCIA ~ Rite of Welcome ('Cont.)

THE PERIOD OF THE CATECHUMENATE

The catechumenate is the second of four stages of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. During this period an unbaptized person becomes more deeply acquainted with the people, teachings and practices of the Catholic Church with the expressed desire of becoming a Catholic. He/she is no longer called an 'enquirer' but a 'catechumen' (from the ancient Greek: one who 'echoes the gospel'). The relationship between catechumen and the parish community is a bit like an engaged couple who are seriously preparing for marriage. © The Story Source, 1993.
